
AMERICANS BELIEVE 2 PARTY SYSTEM'S BROKEN; TIME FOR AN ALTERNATIVE


The American people understand what the elites do not -- after years of ideological extremism, extreme partisanship, government dysfunction, and failure to act to advance their needs – the American people are disillusioned with the corrupted two-party system and are looking for an alternative. Despite the torrent of skepticism from Twitter, Washington D.C., the political punditocracy, and partisan elites, the American people reacted positively to the idea that the two-party system is broken and it's time to consider alternatives.

Underlying that support is America's belief the two-party system is broken. Sixty-four percent of Americans agree (34% strongly agree) that the two-party system is broken and it's time for a centrist independent candidate. Driving this belief is their dissatisfaction with the choices for President in 2016. Again, 64% say they were dissatisfied (41% very dissatisfied) with their choices for president in 2016.

In the Presidential election in 2016, were you satisfied or dissatisfied with the choices from the two major parties?






AMERICA'S REACTION TO HOWARD CHALLENGING THE TWO-PARTY SYSTEM






HOWARD ALREADY COMPETITVE IN A HYPOTHEICAL THREE-WAY RACE

SURVEY OVERVIEW

GS Strategy Group conducted a poll January 29-31, 2019 among 1500 likely voters nationwide. The poll produced a margin of error of +/- 2.53% at the 95% confidence level. The respondents were representative of the national electorate as a whole. 50% of interviews were completed by cell phone.
