

THE ROAD TO RECOVERY



“Not an Option, an Immediate Necessity”

Our nation is at the brink of dissolution, and thanks to the insanity of the reigning political class, including President Joe Biden and his Senate Majority Leader Chuck Schumer, it is difficult to estimate whether the greater threat comes from potential nuclear war between superpowers, or a total physical breakdown of food and energy supply lines.

I decided to launch my campaign against Schumer, the Senator from Wall Street, early in 2019 shortly after the February 12 death of the American genius Lyndon LaRouche. LaRouche was the greatest economic forecaster of all time, and in 2014, at the age of 92, he had composed an emergency outline for economic recovery entitled, “The Four New Laws to Save the USA Now! Not an Option: An Immediate Necessity.”

As COVID-19 swept through the land, it became clear how prescient LaRouche’s warnings had been. Our healthcare system was in a shambles, our nursing homes neglected and understaffed, our food processing plants held by monopolies and the lack of regard for the well-being of our people was obvious everywhere. A health crisis which could have been used to mobilize people to upgrade our hospitals and nursing homes, improve public sanitation, and modernize and repair public housing,

instead became the excuse to print trillions of dollars for Wall Street banks while millions of Americans lost their livelihoods and their loved ones.

The time to implement LaRouche’s program is already long overdue, but it’s not too late to save ourselves and future generations—if the American people can find the courage to buck the officially approved narrative and demand the needed remedy.

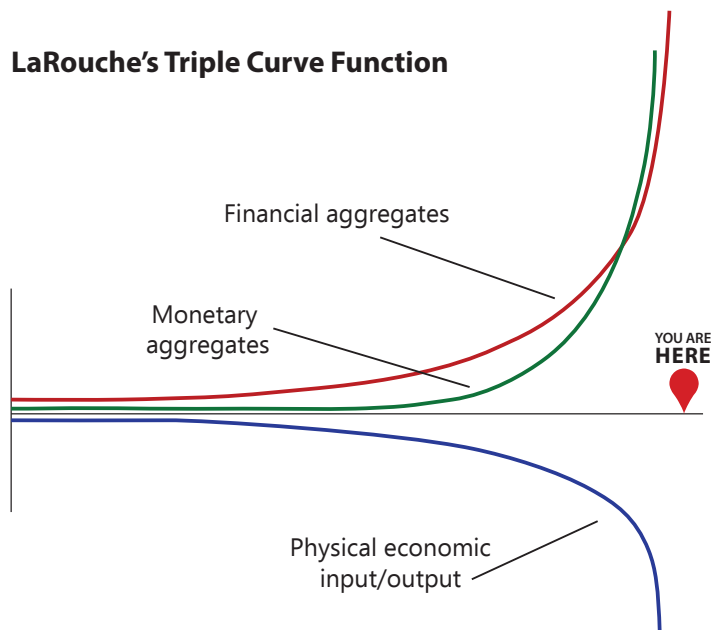
First, let’s locate ourselves on the “map” below, known as LaRouche’s Triple Curve Function. The far left of the curve is probably about 1966. You see there that the three lines are together. That was before the disastrous 1971 Nixon decoupling of the dollar from the gold reserve system, when money supply, the Dow Jones Industrial Average, and the actual physical production of the United States workforce were integrally related. Increases in physical economic activity drove increases in the markets.

After August 15, 1971 that was ended, and with the introduction of floating exchange rates and derivatives speculation, the relationship between physical production and the so-called market indicators became one of inverse proportion. It was literally the case that the higher the Dow Jones went, the more had been looted from the means of the American people to exist. After the 2008 bailout and the ensuing “quantitative easing” the money supply and derivatives went “off the chart,” and now we are at the shock front end of the system.

Fiddling with interest rates by the unconstitutional Federal Reserve will only make matters worse.

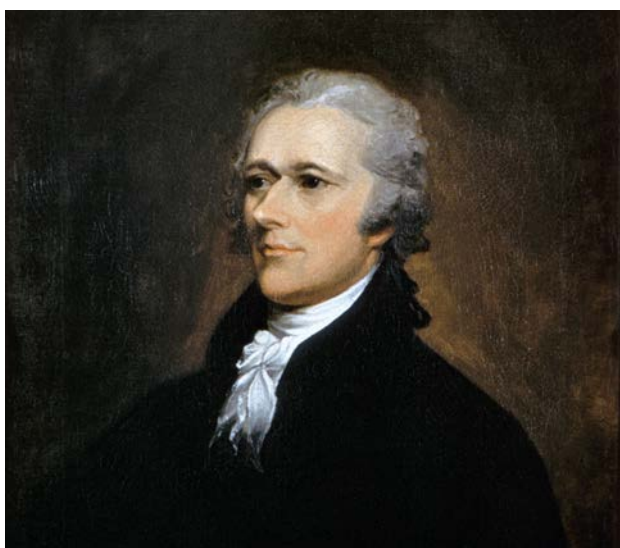
What is needed is a full bankruptcy reorganization, where the gambling debt is simply written off. It cannot be saved, and it must not be the policy of the United States to kill billions of people on the planet in a foolish attempt to salvage it. This needs to be done in collaboration with other major powers; namely Russia and China, and hopefully India, all of which would be greatly relieved to see us come to our senses. A New Bretton Woods conference should be organized to bring this about.

Lyndon LaRouche's Four Laws

1. **Reinstate the FDR-era Glass-Steagall Act.** Commercial banks, which handle the savings and loan activities of private individuals and businesses, must be completely separated from investment banks so that the average taxpayer is not on the hook for losses incurred by speculative activity. After 66 years of protecting our community banks, Glass-Steagall was repealed in 1999, a disastrous move which Schumer aggressively supported on behalf of his Wall Street sponsors.
2. **Nationalize the Federal Reserve.** In order to build infrastructure on the scale desperately needed, we must reconstitute the National Bank of the United States as first established by Alexander Hamilton. It is urgent to have a top-down transparent economic and credit system, accountable to the American people, to determine where credit is to be allocated, as opposed to a private bankers' cabal meeting in Jackson Hole or Davos.
3. **The National Bank and the US Treasury must direct credit into those areas which increase the productivity of the American workforce.** This means water management and a dramatic increase in energy supply only attainable through nuclear fission and fusion, modern high speed rail, an advanced healthcare system sup-

- ported by appropriate hospital infrastructure and trained personnel, including mental health care, and finally, a high standard of public education capable of producing a highly skilled, literate workforce, capable of making and assimilating discoveries of new universal principles.
4. **A crash program for the development of thermonuclear fusion power.** The evolution of life on this planet and the advances of the human species prove that we must move to ever-more intense forms of energy to survive. It is natural for each generation to consume more energy per capita than the previous one, and such growth is a necessity. Development of fusion energy will be key to greening the deserts and doubling food production on this planet, as well as for powering rockets in an international mobilization to establish the first manned colony on Mars.

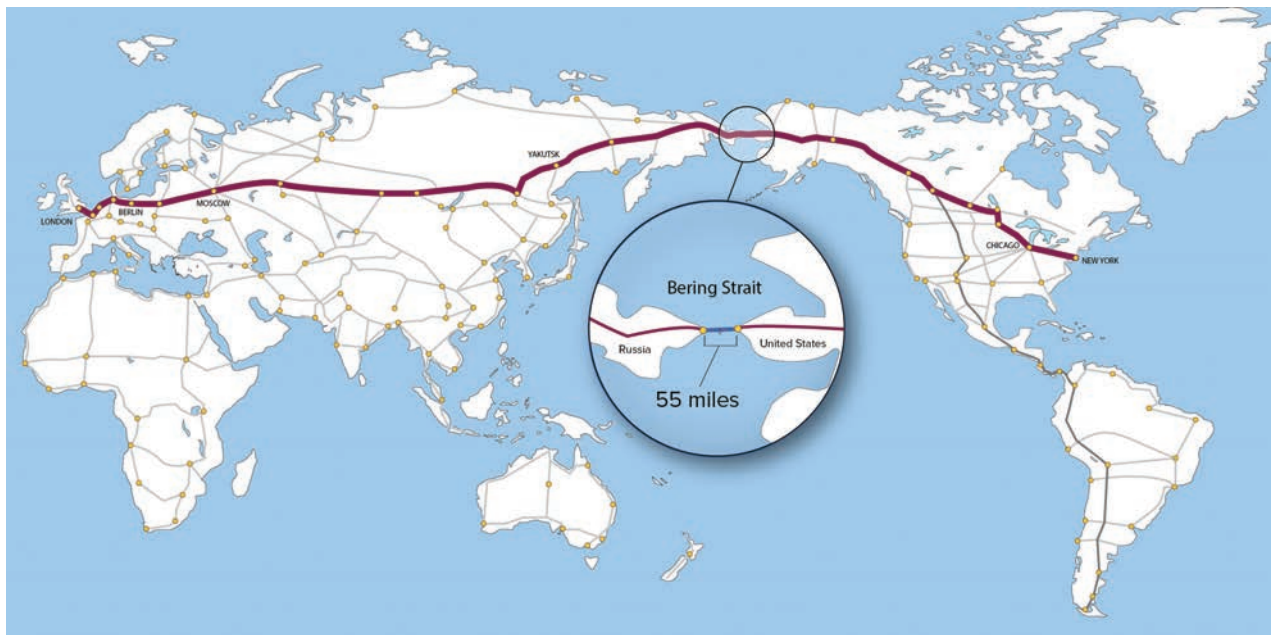

Proposed High-Speed Rail Corridors

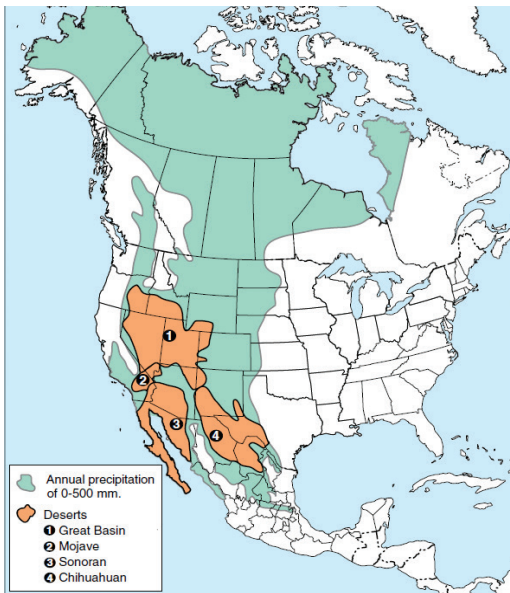


Empire Corridor to the Bering Strait

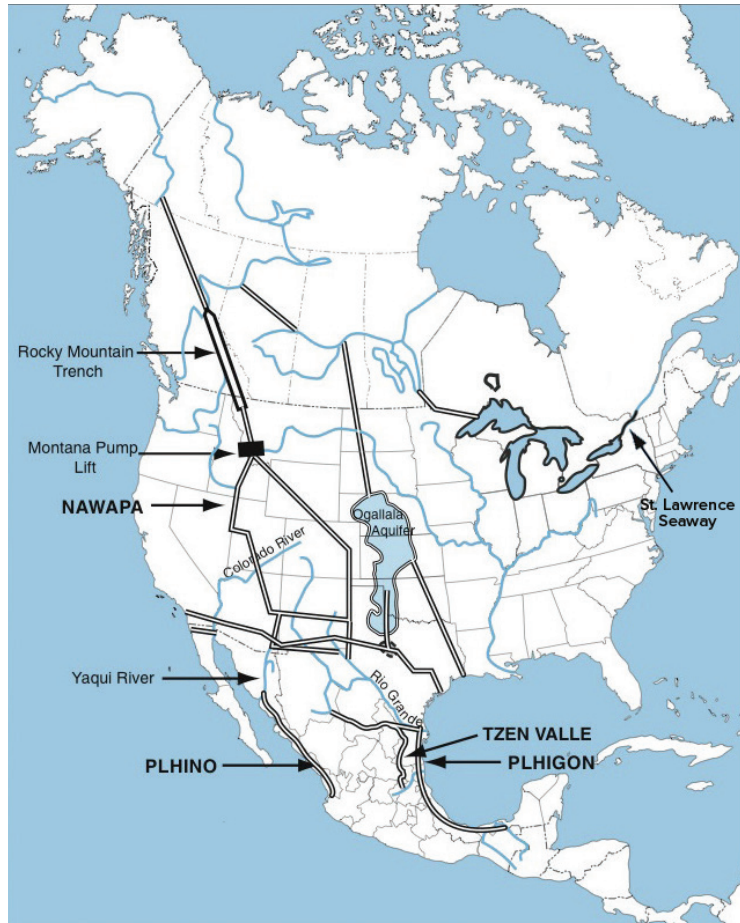

Aim for the Stars: Fusion Power and Mars Colonization

If our recovery is to be successful, as in any war, we must have a concept of victory by which to measure the effectiveness of our efforts. While eradication of extreme poverty and hunger are noble ideals, and morally imperative, we won't be able to accomplish even that unless we set our sights higher: in the stars themselves.

As LaRouche elaborates in his Fourth Law, the development of our solar system, planet, and biosphere has been a process of anti-entropic growth, from lower, less energy dense forms of life such as bacteria and algae, to self-temperature-regulating mammals, to extremely complex energy-dense systems as can be seen in a modern city like Beijing where millions of people are sustained at a relatively high standard of living powered by the consumption of large amounts of energy, which allows indoor plumbing and temperature regulation, refrigeration of food, modern fast transportation and a high standard of medical care. Cutting back energy consumption will lead to the deaths of billions of people.

The development of controlled thermonuclear fusion as a power source for human society is absolutely required to establish a new platform of existence on this planet.

A Colony on Mars

With our formerly great industrial cities crumbling into horror shows of violence and depravity, people might

ask, "Why should we spend all that money on space, when we need it here?" Have you stopped to consider that there are no merchants on the Moon or Mars? All of the money spent on the space program was spent on Earth, and in the case of the Apollo Mission, employing over half a million people in challenging, well-paying, rewarding careers. It was shown that every dollar spent on getting to the Moon generated \$10–14 in related economic activity.

But it's not about money. As Kennedy expressed it at Rice University in 1962, it is human nature to seek such challenges which ensure the immortality of mankind. As Lyndon LaRouche put it in his 1986 paper, *The Science and Technology Needed to Colonize Mars*:

"At present, broadly speaking, Americans lack those psychological potentials for space exploration which existed during the 1960s and earlier. Through the influence of those irrationalists, such as the 'ecologists' and the counterculture generally, many of our citizens have lost connection with the principles of moral character and science-like intellectual development traditional to the Augustinian heritage. We, as a nation, are presently in the process of being self-destructed by the growing influence of the 'ecologists' and the radical counterculture.

"This recent difficulty is not, however, an argument against space exploration. Precisely the opposite; the psychological demands placed upon our society by bold ventures into space, are precisely the stimulant best recommended to bring us back to ourselves, our moral heritage."

The Importance of Culture

The United States is experiencing an explosion of violence. It takes many forms, from mass shootings, to stabbings, to shoving people in front of subway trains, to families suiciding themselves, to 100,000 drug overdose deaths in one year alone. Divisive debates about the Second Amendment, which allow a great deal of self-righteous huffing and puffing, merely serve to evade the fact that we have created the conditions where millions of people have become convinced that there is no role for them in society, and that they have no future.

There are many interrelated reasons for this demoralization and despair. Working Americans are experiencing extreme anxiety as the cost of basic necessities like food and shelter rapidly outpace their income and their credit card debt balloons out of control.

For younger people, the hysteria-mongering “climate change” screamers have convinced many that extreme weather is caused by human activity, with the obvious solution: fewer humans, less climate change.

If we undertook the program of which I have expressed merely a shadow in this little booklet, it would become obvious that every human soul is needed to fulfill the mission before us. We would still have plenty of urgent remedial work to do, but it would be informed by an optimistic brotherly love of the potential within each of our neighbors. Some remedial areas to be funded would include drug rehabilitation, mental health facilities with in-patient care, literacy programs, vocational and technical schools, and programs for millions of our veterans to transition into a leadership corp of the skilled workforce.

We must restore classical artistic education in every public school. Every child should be given the opportunity to learn to play at least one musical instrument and to sing in a chorus. Participation in classical musical performance, especially in ensembles, not only develops motor skills and aesthetic growth, but demonstrates the richness of combining our talents—the whole is infinitely greater than the sum of its parts.

As the world hurtles toward nuclear war and economic ruin, the program in the preceding pages might seem like the proverbial “pie in the sky.” Aside from the fact that we will simply not survive if we don’t radically change course, there is historical precedent for such a willful change for the better. LaRouche’s widow Helga Zepp-LaRouche has called for a New Bretton Woods—a new peace and economic development order among all nations, which is premised not merely on the original WWII-era Bretton Woods, but more significantly on the 1648 Treaty of Westphalia, where leaders of brutally warring religious factions, who had committed unspeakable atrocities against each other over more than 30 years, decided that there was no future unless debts were forgiven, and each party acted in the interest of the other. If you don’t think this is possible today, then you don’t realize how much trouble you’re in. Once that is understood, I am optimistic that we will muster the courage to act accordingly.
